“Fire in Brazil” Entered into Prestigious Film Competition

The documentary “Fire in Brazil” which chronicles the widespread Christian revival sweeping the nation of Brazil has been entered in competition at the prestigious Sabaoth Film Festival in Milan Italy. The 47 minute film traces the history of Brazil’s current national interest in the Christian life and walk and features interviews with both key national and local leaders. Filming took place throughout much of the massive country and was a logistical challenge. Literally filmmakers took cars, planes, train, buses and automobiles to traverse the country and get this story that has needed to be told. What the crew found was that the revival is not partial to denominational or religious boundaries. Both Protestant churches and Roman Catholic churches are seeing record attendances and growth. In one rural church, attendance approximately 50, the music and worship would rival anything found across the U.S. or Europe.

An interesting twist to the story in the film is that, at one time, Brazil was filled with missionaries from the U. S. and Europe. Today thousands of missionaries, charity workers and teachers have left Brazilian shores for Europe and the U.S. In fact, the organisation that sponsors the bi-annual Sabaoth Film Festival - Ministerio Sabaoth - is led by a Brazilian Pastor: Pastor Roselen Boerner Faccio from Campinas, Brazil.

The film “Fire in Brazil” is not the first time that HFC International and OLI Productions has entered in the Sabaoth Film Festival. In 2006 their film “Awakening Israel” was a finalist in the “Best Documentary Film” category. The film is part of HFCI’s “Into All the World” film series currently being broadcast on 10 TV networks across the Middle East, Russia, the C. I. S. countries, in Arabic across North America & Mexico, Australia, Romania, the U.K., New Zealand, Indonesia, Holland and Israel and worldwide on cable and satellite.
